A bitesize overview of the curriculum.

YEAR 1

- The Michaelmas and Lent Terms are for developing skills in all areas of the subject, taking creative risks and preparing a portfolio of work.
- Areas include experimental darkroom use, digital camera basics, use of the studio, exploring themes and concepts across contemporary photography as well as the Adobe Creative Suite of software.
- The Trinity Term marks the start of the Personal Investigation (coursework element), your self-directed project on a theme of your choosing.
- Year 1 is heavily practical-based, with written elements supporting progress.

YEAR 2

- The Personal Investigation continues across the Michaelmas Term, and into the Lent Term.
- In February, the externally set assignment (ESA) begins, where you choose a topic to explore from a set list of starting points. This is a shorter, quicker project where you utilise all the skills that you've developed across the previous pieces of work.
- The ESA culminates in 15 hours of sustained supervised practical work, spread across three days.
- Your work for the Personal Investigation and ESA can then be seen in our End of Year Exhibition in the final week of the year.
